

SA-P-5105 - UNIFORMS POLICY

The Board of Fei Tian Academy of the Arts-Middletown (FTAA-MT) intends to help FTAA-MT promote a more effective learning climate; foster school unity and pride; improve student performance; foster self-esteem; eliminate label competition; simplify dressing and minimize costs to parents; teach children appropriate dress and decorum in their “work” place; and help to improve student conduct and discipline.

Therefore, the Board requires a mandatory uniform policy.

I. DEFINITION OF UNIFORM WEAR

A. A uniform is:

1. A manufactured, formal and traditional uniform, such as jumpers, pants, plaid outfits, shirts, sweaters with school emblems, etc. Such clothing is usually purchased from one vendor or a local store that supplies uniforms.

B. Uniforms may not consist of clothing that constitutes a health and safety hazard that is disruptive to the educative process.

C. Every effort should be made to select a uniform that is durable, easy to care for, and cost effective.

II. PURCHASING OF UNIFORMS

A. The sale of uniforms must not be used as a fundraiser for either the school or the PA/PTA.

B. School personnel and members of PA/PTA may not collect funds from parents for the purchase of uniforms.

C. School personnel and PA/PTA are prohibited from providing vendors with student/parent names and addresses.

III. NOTICE

A. The principal/designee must ensure that parents, staff, and students receive written notice of the uniform policy. (See Exhibit A) Such notice must be provided annually.

B. The notice must:

1. Describe and/or enclose a photo of the uniform and explain the purpose, expectations, and benefits of the uniform policy;
2. Advise parents that the cost of the uniform will be included in the tuition fees.
3. Advise parents whether discipline will be imposed for failure to comply with the uniform requirement in compliance with the FTAA-MT Code of Conduct and Discipline Matrix.

IV. DISCIPLINE

Students shall be subject to discipline as set forth in the Code of Conduct and Discipline Matrix.
